

## **EXAMINATION SYSTEM**

Academic year is divided into Two Semesters. The first Semester is from July to November and the Second Semester is from December to May. Each Semester has Theory and Practical exams and a Mid Term exam too.

Note: It is mandatory to attend the semester exams and Mid Term Exams. No Re-Examination will be conducted if the student is absent for theory or practical exams.

The students who are in the earlier system of annual Exams in the University also will follow the same patterns in the college for the sake of continuous evaluation and assessment.

# A. Rules of attendance/semester examination eligibility

On medical grounds a student is permitted a condonation of 10 % attendance on payment of condonation fee, provided the student submits the medical certificate immediately after the period of illness. Students having less than 65 % of attendance in a subject will not be allowed to write the examination for the subject.

Students attending state/national camps/workshops have to produce the attendance certificate duly signed by the principal immediately after the camps. A student who is not allowed to write Semester Exam due to shortage of attendance has to repeat the year.

On medical grounds a student is permitted a condonation of 10 % attendance on payment of condonation fee, provided the student submits the medical certificate immediately after the period of illness. Students having less than 65 % of attendance in a subject will not be allowed to write the examination for the subject.

Students attending state/national camps/workshops have to produce the attendance certificate duly signed by the principal immediately after the camps.

A student who is not allowed to write Semester Exam or Pre University examination due to shortage of attendance has to repeat the year.

# A. Attendance

- In-house Publications: The Editorial Board of the college, along with student representatives with a flair for writing, publish the college Quarterly News Letter and Annual Magazine.
